DID YOU KNOW? A Former Ryde Resident has a Mountain Named After Him

Frank Edward Carr was born in Ryde Township Dec 19 1886. His name adorns Mount Carr in Garibaldi Park in B.C. Frank was a Vancouver Post Office clerk and former executive member of the B.C. Mountaineering Club who served with the 7th Battalion, Canadian Expeditionary Forces, in Canada, England and France in the Great War, and was killed in action in France 26 April 1915. With no known grave, his name is inscribed on the Ypres [Menin Gate] Memorial. Ypres (now leper) is a Belgian town where each night at 8 pm the traffic is stopped at the Menin Gate while members of the local Fire Brigade sound the Last Post in the roadway under the Memorial's arches.
