At the session on March 11th, Barbara Cowan presented a wealth of information regarding the products we use on our skin.

- The easiest thing to remember is that if it has a fragrance or "parfume" listed, don't use the product.
- Chemicals can cause lasting abnormalities, not only to the person using it, but to our entire environment, including male or female hormones.
- Look for products that are organic in nature, meaning they could actually be eaten.
- · Discard make-up once it's at the expiry date.
- Do not use any make-up that has "nano-__" in it. Those tiny micro bits, which are used to
