The Challenge Ahead

The Ryde Community Centre will stay open for another year. Gravenhurst Council approved \$6000 in operating costs and set aside \$3000 in the rural reserve fund that may be available if needed to resolve a roof drainage problem. It is time for a sigh of relief, a celebration and a new beginning.

The Ryde Community Co-op has undertaken to keep the Town's expenditures on routine operating costs to \$6000. The Board of Directors believes this can be done with the co-operation of the Town through a combination of cost saving measures and fund raising. As a community we need to take a more active role in the stewardship of the building. We need to envision fund raising that will build on community spirit and bring in money from

outside the community because we are offering something of interest and value. At the same time, we want to continue our tradition of providing community activities that are affordable and fun.

Let's celebrate together at the Ham Dinner (with vegetarian option) on May 14th and brainstorm solutions at the Annual General Meeting that follows. We had a great turn out at the Pot Luck Supper and the Town Council meeting in March. We need to carry that kind of enthusiasm into the AGM on May 14th, if we are going to have a community centre in the former Ryde Public School for years to come. ❖
