

Lorraine's Yummies!

Thank you to Lorraine Masters for sharing her recipe with us! These no-cook squares were a very big hit at the recent Spaghetti Dinner and didn't last long.

Ingredients

1 (250 g.) box of Ritz Crackers - Original Flavour 1 (14 oz.) can of Eagle Brand sweetened condensed milk 1 small (225 g.) package of Skor Bits

Method

Crush (or as Lorraine would say, "Squish and squish and squish!") the crackers into fine crumbs while still sealed in the bag. Pour the crumbed crackers into a bowl. Pour the condensed milk on top of the crackers, add the Skor Bits and stir until completely mixed. Line a 9 inch square pan with parchment or waxed paper, pour mixture into pan and pack it in tight using the back of a spoon. Refrigerate until set - 1 to 2 hours. Cut into small squares to serve.
