Thanks to the thousands of supporters, both organizations protect and steward over 16,000 acres of land from Shanty Bay to Parry Sound. If you love the wild places in this area, here are some ways you can help protect and explore nature this summer.

The Couchiching Conservancy's Landowner Stewardship Program provides landowners in the Black River Wildlands with the tools and skills to protect and steward their land. Through this free and voluntary program staff will:

- Support you in long-term stewardship projects tailored to your goals
- Train you to monitor species, provide best management practices, and more!

Muskoka Conservancy & local trails to explore:

- Upjohn Nature Reserve- 2.5 kilometers of trails, has large wetland and supports several Species at Risk. Located just north of Bracebridge
- Cooper's Falls Trail provides access to similar habitat and ecosystem types.
